- Last year, the community voted to start a task force, which met this
 past year to consider options and draft recommendations
- Members:

 - Danny Halperin
 - Sandor Fekete
 - Jeff Phillips
 - Monique Teillund
 - Hubert Wagner
- The result was a recommendation and accompanying report, which was emailed to the community

Results of the vote

- 42 votes for option 1: Keep SoCG single track and single PC, and work to address concerns within the current model, e.g. by strengthening and enforcing reviewing based on paper types.
- 132 votes for option 2: Move ahead to implement a second track "B", for "applied" and "implementation" papers, broadly defined, in the general spirit of the recommendation of the task force report, with exact details of its implementation subject to further discussion within the community.
- 6 votes for option 3: I do not like either option.

Some concerns raised

- We thank all who sent detailed feedback and concerns
- Much feedback focused on the need to clearly articulate expectations for this new track, to enable strong contributions and quality reviews
- One issue in particular got several comments: papers which fall "in between" the two tracks, which perhaps contain theorems but also implement or apply the results
